REPORTS FROM PRIORITY AGENCIES

- Beverly Hills Unified School District (BHUSD) BHUSD Governing School Board Member Honorable Mary Wells provided an oral presentation to the Commission. Highlights included suicide prevention month, COVID metrics, testing and vaccination, and modified quarantine.
- Beverly Hills Police Department Sergeant Jesse Perez was available for questions as the stand-in representative of the Beverly Hills Police Department. He spoke on executive shared crime metrics and response times and spoke on the Neighborhood Watch and JUST IN CASE, BH programs.
- Beverly Hills Fire Department A-Shift Platoon Battalion Chief Timothy Hayes updated the Commission on incidents and responses metrics, strike team and deployment assignments, and structure fires.

1. Moment of Mindfulness

Lisa Kring, LCSW, led the Commission in a "Moment of Mindfulness" which teaches mental health, resiliency, and mindfulness techniques. The Commission participated in a mindful meditation for this month's topic of brain health and memory, which supports stress reduction.

This item recognizes employees who have gone beyond their daily responsibilities to contribute to the City's health and safety efforts. This month the Health and Safety Commission honored Community Development Supervising Plan Engineer Arlen Eskandari.

3. Smoking and Tobacco Informational Update

Management Analyst Gabrielle Ressa provided an informational update. She spoke on the current hardship exemption application, sidewalk decals scheduled to be placed in the business triangle, and smoking cessation.
